The Golden Belt Manufacturing Company was founded in 1887 by Julian S. Carr to aid in the production of muslin bags for tobacco. Technological advancements fueled growth, and by 1901 the new Golden Belt factory had over 700 employees.

The plant was divided into a cotton mill and a bag factory. In addition, about 50 mill houses were erected in the surrounding neighborhood, and nearby residents were hired to work from home stringing and tagging tobacco bags.

In 1912 a local inventor named John Dalton created a machine that inserted drawstrings into tobacco bags, making Golden Belt Manufacturing Company the first of the three major bag producers in the country to be able to do so.

The tracks at Belt Line Station serviced the route between Durham and Lynchburg, VA. Known as the Northern & Western Railway, the line was pivotal in sending the products manufactured at Golden Belt to destinations around the world.

As demand for tobacco declined in the mid-20th century, Golden Belt pivoted to produce packaging for cigarettes, plastics, textiles, and yarn until finally closing in 1996.

Since 2008, the remodeled and rebranded Golden Belt Campus has served as a mixed-use office, retail, residential, and arts community and event space in Eastern Durham.
